Program Enrollment Requirements: Students must apply and be accepted into the BAS-ID Program. See college website for complete application requirements: <http://www.cptc.edu/programs/basid>
Program Starts: Fall, and Spring Terms, the program is six to eight quarters in length depending on the time students need to complete all graduation requirements.
Program class times: **Upper Level DSN Course Schedule: Up to three Saturdays per quarter 9:00am-12:00** The other courses in the degree are available online or hybrid (a combination of face-to-face and online learning).
Graduation Requirements: Students must earn a minimum grade of 2.0 in all coursework to complete the degree

Pre-requisites required prior to Admission to the BAS-ID program

Applied Associate degree, Associate of Applied Science –T, Direct Transfer Associate Degree (DTA) or equivalent (90 or more quarter credits) in Interior Design or related discipline (such as architecture) **with a minimum overall GPA of 2.3**

A minimum grade of 2.0 is required in the following 5 credit transferable General Education Coursework:

English Composition: ENGL& 101 English Composition, or higher equivalent (5 cr)

Social Science: PSYC& 100 General Psych., or SOC& 101 Intro to Sociology, or other (5 cr)

Bridge Courses: For students admitted to the BAS-ID program with a degree unrelated to interior design or architecture, the following courses (or equivalent) must be completed prior to upper-level (300-400) Interior Design Coursework.
